SHOWING ADMIRABLE SPIRIT

It is a pleasure to note the admirable spirit which the members and officers of the fire department are manifesting under trying conditions. They are justifying the confidence which Salamanca people always have felt and so frequently have manifested in the volunteer department that has served this community so zealously and efficiently.

Secretary Normile stated an undoubted fact when he told the wardens meeting that the department could count on the support of the citizens of Salamanca and appealed to the department to stop talk of disbanding. The history and traditions of the department and its present personnel alike give assurance that there will be no precipitate action, but that the firemen will continue to be guided by good sense and a spirit of service to the community. And if they do so they can with perfect safety, as Mr. Normile suggested, look to the citizens in the confident expectation of receiving justice from the public.

Some sour corn mash seized in a raid by prohibition officers in Batavia was spilled while being unloaded at police headquarters. A hungry sparrow ate of it and toppled over dead. What a pleasant feeling that must give purchasers of the corn juice produced by the beneficent proprietors of the still.

Western New York has a keen interest in rumors that Speaker Mahon of the Assembly will not seek reelection, having received an offer of the presidency of one of the largest banks in the northern part of the state. Assemblyman Joseph A. McGinley, chairman of the Ways and Means Committee, is next in line, and Mr. McGinley comes from Chautauque county—which is almost as good as being a Cattaraugus man.

Motion picture theatre owners in convention at Albany have adopted a resolution declaring that no film featuring persons "guilty or involved in any indecent, immoral or lewd affair" should be shown in theatres of the association. Highly commendable action. Now it will be interesting to note whether actors and actresses involved in divorce scandals are classified among the "decent and

moral" or the "indecent and immoral."

SKETCH-PLAN TO SAVE RAILROAD LINES \$300,000,000

Owners of Railroad Securities Claim Can be Effected Through Central Agency to Own and Operate Cars. Washington, Feb. 16.—Experts for the National Association of Owners of Railroad Securities outlined to the Interstate States commission today a plan for controlling railroad equipment purchase and operation which they said would save annually more than \$300,000,000.

Details of the plan, as set forth by W. W. Gohlitz, engineering expert for the association, provide for organization of a central agency under supervision of the commission to purchase and own a large proportion of the freight cars now owned by the railroads. This organization would arrange for repair and rebuilding of all the bad order cars, would purchase new ones and enlarge the stock of other cars of special design, and lease them to the railroads for carriage of freight.

The savings would be made, the association representative said, from the cheaper rates at which such a central agency could borrow money for purchases and betterments, the mobility with which the cars could be transferred from one section of the country to another or from one railroad to another, as traffic conditions required, and from the decrease in the total number of cars which would be required.

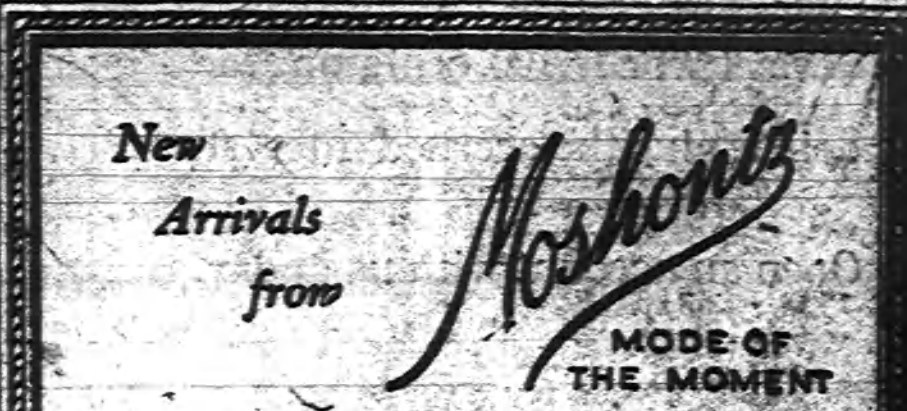
