WOODBURY — Services for David Cook, of Wenonah, who was struck and killed by a train here Saturday, will be tomorrow at 11 a.m. in the Southwood Baptist Church. Burial will be in Woodbury Memorial Park.

A viewing will be held tonight from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Smith Funeral Home, 47 Main Street, Mantua.

Mr. Cook, who was 20, was run over by a southbound Pennsylvania-Reading Seashore Lines train at 8:05 a.m.

He was pronounced dead on arrival at Underwood Memorial Hospital here. He had lived with his parents at 305 N. Princeton Ave., Wenonah.

#### Misty Morning

Det. Sgt. Malin, who investigated the death, said the train engineer "had seen something on the tracks between Curtis Avenue and Center Street, but it was a misty, windy morning and it could have been almost anything."

"We don't know whether he had passed out or what," Malin said.

By the time the conductor realized that it was a human being, Malin said, "it was too late to stop the train."

Malin said Mr. Cook had been at a religious meeting in Pitman Friday night and that he had returned to his Wenonah home and then "zoned out again on foot at about 5 a.m. Saturday."

#### Notified Police

"His parents tried to find him," he said, "and they notified police that he was out."

Mr. Cook is survived by his parents, Paul and Mildred Cook; a brother, Paul, of Berkeley, Calif., and a sister, Mrs. Patricia Stahl, of Chicago.
